# Escure Ranch Ride Saturday, March 14, 2009 10:30 AM

Once again PBCH will converge on Escure Ranch south of Sprague, WA. The ride will venture west and northwest of

the ranch to the area of the famed Wall Lake. We finally "discovered" this lake a couple of years ago while riding the scablands and we could get lucky and find it again!

This is, of course, an early season ride, but the difficulty level is not high, so the conditioning level of your horse/mule should not be a big concern. One thing that could be a problem is the surface we will be riding on. The scablands are a rocky, basalt surface so horse shoes may be needed depending on your animal's feet.

It will be mid-March so the weather could be a factor. Come prepared for anything except temperatures above 85 degrees. That is not likely.

So, how do you get there? Head out I-90 westbound to the Sprague, WA exit. At the stop sign after exiting, turn left (southbound) on Hwy 23 and proceed 12 miles to Davis Road. Davis Rd intersects from the west (on your right) at a place where Hwy 23 makes a sharp left turn. You soon make a sharp left-right-left turns then you proceed southbound approximately 7 miles to the Revere grain elevators on your right. About a  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile or so past the elevators, make a left turn on Knott Rd and proceed south about 2 and  $\frac{1}{4}$  miles watching for a BLM Information sign on your right. Taking a right, you immediately cross a cattle guard and proceed south another 2+ miles to the ranch. The last two miles will be a slow go because it is rough and pretty much one lane all the way.

Look for PBCH signs at the major intersections from Davis Rd on to the ranch. Don't forget your lunch for the ride. Any questions, call the Lionbergers at 772-2964, or Bob Williams at 509-244-9447.

The Sunday Dutch oven cook-off has about 4 teams going – need more to sign up. Marilyn asked about the chapter display – she will bring it. There will be a colt training contest again. The dinner for auction will cost \$15.

CPR training needs to be done again, but there needs to be interest in taking it before Perry sets it up. There are several that are interested and Debbie will ask through her email list for interested folks. Joni took it at the hospital for about \$15 also.

Perry was in charge of the trail committee and will put the schedule in the next newsletter. March 14 there will be a ride





Dig out those Dutch ovens, because we are going to show off our great food and attitudes. Let's show the general public how we BCH'ers cook up some good grub in the back country. This is a chance to get folks enthused about what great food can be created and how well we eat on our back country trips.

# **RULES:**

2 person teams will be made up from bch of Idaho members. There will be room for ten teams. Recipe you are planning to use is required, along with a \$10.00 team entry fee.

This will be a one pot cook off, consisting of either a dessert or bread recipe. Cooking can start at 8:00 am and the dish must be completed by 11:00 am for judging. Teams will be judged on creativity, taste, cleanliness, presentation and interaction with the public. Prizes go to the top three teams.

We will provide two 8' tables for each team. Each team <u>must</u> bring their own cook table to cook on, or a pan to protect the asphalt floor. Teams will need to bring briquettes, water, equipment and food necessary to complete your dish. Each team will be responsible for clean up of their area.

The public will be able to buy a plate for \$2.00 to get three samples from the Dutch oven teams. Money collected will go toward the fairgrounds barn rental.

This competition is about encouraging the skill of using the Dutch oven without the use of additional pans such as bread pan tins, tinfoil, etc. Trivets under meat and parchment paper are acceptable.
