# PANHANDLE BACK COUNTRY HORSEMEN GENERAL MEETING JANUARY 16, 2010 MINUTES

President Bob Williams called the meeting to order at 7:35 pm.

Guests: Nick & Ashlie Johnson and Lyle & Roberta Hudson

November Minutes were for information only.

Bob Williams gave a presentation on Hypothermia and the heating properties of cotton and wool.

TREASURES REPORT – Bills to be paid were: \$12.71 to Linda Wuest for door prize; \$30.14 to Debbie Samovar for printing expenses; \$40 for the PO Box rental. Gene Bruce made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Al Linscott, motion passed. Sharon Bruce went over the 2010 budget, Gene Bruce made a motion to accept the budget, Lea Williams 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed. One of our CD's is maturing this month. Sharon Bruce will withdraw the money and send the payment to the state for the 2010 calendars, and the gifts to the State's Legal Fund and the National's General Fund.

TRAILER STICKER – Bob Williams opened the discussion on this issue. April Linscott said she read the legislature and was concerned about how it is written. It's not written that the funds would be controlled by horsemen and that the money could be sent to AVT trails. Robert Wuest stated that there grant monies are being tightened up and there are no funds for trails and if we don't buy stickers, in essence putting into the funds, we won't get any money. If we're not contributing, then we won't get much out of what little grant monies there are. Also Gov. Butch Otter has ordered an accounting of the current sticker funds by county to see where the money is going. Bob Williams asked April Linscott if she would write a letter regarding her concerns and bring it to the next meeting. Jim Kimball so made a motion, Sharon Bruce 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed.

EVENTS COMMITTEE – Gene Bruce, Jim Kimball, Karen Kimball, Diane Shriner and Bob Williams have volunteered and will be meeting at the next BoD meeting or prior.

TUNE-UP CLINIC - Perry Saathoff reported that he has been in contact with Krista Porter, will again provide services at Mica Ranch. Last year we had several people who RSVP'd but didn't show, as someone else arranged a clinic with another vet who offered lower prices. This left the club with extra food and a vet with extra staff that wasn't need.

If you can line up a vet for cheaper, please let us know. Additionally, if you say you are coming, be there. Show up or Pay up! Side note, Krista is no longer with McKinney Peters.

PROGRESSIVE POT – Linda Wuest had been picking up the door prizes. Lea Williams talked about how she set up a Progressive Pot in one of her clubs. Members come to the meeting, put a dollar in the pot, then a name is pulled out of the hat and they win the pot. Winner must be present to collect; if not there the money rolls over to the next meeting. This raised attendance to the 100's and the biggest pot award was over \$600. Sharon Bruce made a motion that we do the progressive pot instead of a door prize with a split of 50/50 between the club and the winner, Perry Saathoff 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed. GPS training will be March 6<sup>th</sup> 9:00 – Noon. Wal-Mart has cheap units. SPOT training will be March 20<sup>th</sup> 3:00 – 7:00 prior to our regular meeting. If you have your own equipment, bring it with you to the training, plus work with it some so you know the basic workings.

Perry Saathoff made a motion to adjourn, Gene Bruce 2<sup>nd</sup>, meeting adjourned at 9:18



### **Hypothermia** by Bob Williams

Hypothermia is a sudden drop in body temperature or core temperature. We are a tropical or warm blooded being and just as our temperature rises three to four degrees above normal, we are in trouble with a fever. If our temperature drops three to four degrees the symptoms start to be somewhat the same.

- 1. A slowing of the thought process
- 2. Teeth chattering, shaking
- 3. If warming doesn't happen soon, energy is used up and the temperature continues down.
- 4. It reaches where reasoning is flawed or gone. If not helped now, deep sleep and death will follow.
- 5. Here is the kicker. Time line 57 degrees, windy day, maybe raining, person is wet and lost or without adequate cloths or cover for 50 to 70 minutes. Coma and if not in medical care, death and perhaps even with medical care.

We live in the North West, north being a key word here. How we think and prepare for our own well being. We have all been going for a short ride, hike on a nice day and had the weather change in a short few minutes. How well we prepare is how well we fare in a given situation.

Clothes, on or carried behind the saddle. Most of us carry a slicker, or something tied on their saddle but I have been on poker rides manning a station on a less than warm day and had families on four horses come by dressed for what the weather was like when the left the trailhead. My fire was welcome as was my coffee. So you don't have to carry a suitcase, just dress for success in the North West.

# **NOTICE:**

THIS DOCUMENT IS A LEGALLY BINDING CONTRACT LIMITING YOUR RIGHTS TO RECOVER FOR INJURY AND LOSS!

Please read back of application and sign as indicated.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to limit the effect of or replace the limitation of liability provided by Idaho's Equine Activities Immunity Act, Idaho Code § 6-1801 et. seq. This agreement is intended to extend greater protection to the entities named below. By signing this document you waive your rights to bring any legal claim to recover compensation or obtain any other remedy for injury or death to yourself, your spouse, your children, or others for the loss or damage to property, however caused, arising out of the negligent or other tortuous acts of the officers or agents listed below, now or at any time in the future, caused by their actions or failure to act, or otherwise. You also agree to protect, defend, and indemnify the officers or agents listed below against all claims for injuries you cause to others in connections with any of their activities.

- **1. Definitions.** Herein "PBCH" means Panhandle Back Country Horsemen, its officers, agents, activity coordinators, activity leaders; "BCHI" means Back Country Horsemen of Idaho Foundation, its chapters, officers, directors and members. "I" means the undersigned individual, all heirs, and the members of their family, including any minors whether or not accompanying the individual, and the personal representative, executors, and administrators of the individual.
- 2. Release and Waiver of All Claims and Covenant Not to Sue. In consideration of participation in the activities of PBCH and BCHI by me, by my spouse, children and other dependents, I irrevocably waive and release PBCH and BCHI and the owners of all facilities, equipment, and land used in PBCH and BCHI activities from, and WAIVE MY SUBSTANTIAL RIGHT TO ASSERT ANY CAUSE OF ACTION, CLAIM OR DEMANDS OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER, including by not limited to, any claim of negligence, which I may have or acquire in the future against PBCH and BCHI on account of personal injury, property damage, death, or accident of any kind, arising from my involvement in PBCH and BCHI activities, however the injury or damage is caused, including, but not limited to, the negligence of PBCH or BCHI. I contractually release PBCH and BCHI and agree to hold PBCH and BCHI harmless from any and all liability for any claims, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, or suits of any kind or nature whatsoever, which result or may result in the future from activities sponsored by PBCH or BCHI or coordinated by PBCH or BCHI members. This release applies to all PBCH and BCHI activities in the future in which I may participate. This release shall be effective and apply to all my heirs and the members of my family, including any minors, whether or not accompanying me, and my personal representative, executors, and administrators.
- 3. Legal Action Limitation. If any of the entities listed above has to take legal action in relation to this Agreement, and the entity is successful in the action, the unsuccessful party shall pay to the entity, in addition to all sums that the unsuccessful party may be called on to pay, a reasonable sum for the entity's attorney's fees and court costs. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Idaho. Venue for any dispute or litigation arising out of this Agreement shall be in Kootenai County State District Court. Any modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this Agreement shall be binding only if in writing signed by each party or authorized representative of each party. There shall be no oral amendment or modification of this Agreement.
- **4. Acknowledgment of Risk.** I hereby acknowledge and agree that activities of PBCH and BCHI are frequently inherently dangerous and have a high degree of risk. I acknowledge that by execution hereof, I am waiving and releasing all claims against PBCH and BCHI for any injury whatsoever. I agree to participate as a common adventurer, being personally responsible for my own safety and not looking to any others to protect me from harm.
- **5. Statement of Capacity and Understanding.** I will not undertake any activity of PBCH or BCHI without becoming fully aware of the nature and extent of the risks inherent therein. By participation, I am voluntarily assuming the risks. I will not engage in the activities unless I am in good health and have no physical limitations, which could preclude my safe participation. I understand I am responsible for my own instruction in safety and providing for my own safety. I am of lawful age (18 years or older) and other wise legally competent to sign this agreement. I understand that the terms of this agreement are contractual and legally binding. By signing this agreement, I acknowledge that I have carefully read this agreement, and sign if of my own free will.




