January Minutes were read. Karen Kimball made a correction that the grant for Chilco was one project and the chaps were for another. Minutes are now a part of the record.

TREASURES REPORT – Bills to be paid were: \$7.92 to Sharon Bruce for copies; \$50.00 to David Rousher for cash box change; \$14.40 to Joni Lueck for advertising; \$68.10 to Debbie Samovar for stamps and refreshments. Joyce Bissell made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Alan Harper, motion passed.

TUNE-UP CLINIC Saturday, April 24th

The time has come to tune up that horse and hit the trails. The tune up clinic for our horses will be on the 11th of April. Perry and Genia Saathoff will be trail bossing this event. The place is Mica Stables: go south on 95 from CDA, at the top of the first long hill start looking for the PBCH signs. The Vet will start at 8:00 a.m. When you arrive, make sure you sign up with me; horses will be seen in the order that you have signed up. All horses must be checked in by 10:30 a.m.

We will have Breakfast Foods for a sell and free coffee.

The costs are as follows:

6 month coggins/health certificate = \$36

5-way (eastern and western encephalitis, tetanus, influenza and rhino) = \$27

4-way (eastern and western encephalitis, tetanus, and influenza) = \$19

3-way with WNV (eastern and western encephalitis, tetanus) = \$28

WNV = \$25

Alternative combination- good for horses that need the protection of local nasal immunity when exposed to high volumes of other horses.

Intranasal strangles = \$24

Intranasal Influenza = \$ 19

Dr. Sonni Gilbert has offered to provide **routine** floats for \$80 plus sedation, (normally \$10-25 depending on the horse) if there is enough interest.

Marie Creek is the adopted Trail of PBCH. Each year we go out and clear the brush and fallen trees. Some years we go out several times! This year we will be doing our clearing on Saturday, April 10th. We have the directions, we have people who can work, we have the saws, and we have the chainsaws We just need a Trail Boss to head this up. Call Bob Williams @ 509-280-7796 to lead this gang.

The Brand Laws have one reason/purpose and that is to protect all of us who own livestock.

The Idaho Horse Council office has received numerous calls and e-mails about the recent in-crease of horse trailers being pulled over, not only at ports of entry, but throughout the state.

All people hauling horses must have the proper truck license for GVW, trailer brakes, copy of registration for both truck and trailer and either a permanent brand certificate for each horse transported or a bill of sale.

Also, if someone else is transporting your horse, be sure that they have written permission from you in their possession. All trailers must stop at line, the bill of sale is NOT LEGAL if all weigh station. If you do not follow the law you will be fined.

Brand Laws are not new, there have been brand laws on the books since 1902, We believe....


The Brand Laws have one reason/ purpose and that is to protect all of us who own livestock.

It is required by the State of Idaho to get a Brand Inspection within 10 days of time of purchase. Bottom it is ten days over purchase of the equine.

- 1. The livestock carry your brand and you have your brand card
- 2. An Idaho Brand Inspection certificate
- 3. Another states Brand Inspection certificate
- 4. Purebred Registration papers with your name on it
- 5. Written Trip Permit for Intra-state Travel
- 6. Bill of Sale, the Bill of Sale if less than 10 days... Stopping at the Port of Entry Including Roving POE's:
- All livestock entering the state of Idaho MUST stop 7.
- Intra-state Idaho, you MUST stop at all Port of Entries if you are transporting livestock and your Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW) is over 10,000 pounds.

If you get stopped by a Law Enforcement Officer on the road. Be calm, and clearly let himlher know your destination, etc... Also, traveling

Vehicles must be registered for the combined weight of the truck, trailer, and all animals being hauled. A truck with a trailer holding 2 horses or 2 head of cattle will be over the 10,000 pound threshold. This vehicle should be registered on a county non-commercial farm plate.. If the vehicle is registered on a county plate, such as 1A or 2C, the registered weight would be at 8,000, that vehicle will be over the registered weight, and may be subject to fines or to the purchase of a Temporary Weight Permit. In addition, every trailer with an unloaded weight of 1,500 pounds must be equipped with I breakaway battery system.

1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped cabbage


1/2 cup chopped celery

NOTICE:

THIS DOCUMENT IS A LEGALLY BINDING CONTRACT LIMITING YOUR RIGHTS TO RECOVER FOR INJURY AND LOSS!

PLEASE READ BACK OF APPLICATION AND SIGN AS INDICATED.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to limit the effect of or replace the limitation of liability provided by Idaho's Equine Activities Immunity Act, Idaho Code § 6-1801 et. seq. This agreement is intended to extend greater protection to the entities named below. By signing this document you waive your rights to bring any legal claim to recover compensation or obtain any other remedy for injury or death to yourself, your spouse, your children, or others for the loss or damage to property, however caused, arising out of the negligent or other tortuous acts of the officers or agents listed below, now or at any time in the future, caused by their actions or failure to act, or otherwise. You also agree to protect, defend, and indemnify the officers or agents listed below against all claims for injuries you cause to others in connections with any of their activities.

- **1. Definitions.** Herein "PBCH" means Panhandle Back Country Horsemen, its officers, agents, activity coordinators, activity leaders; "BCHI" means Back Country Horsemen of Idaho Foundation, its chapters, officers, directors and members. "I" means the undersigned individual, all heirs, and the members of their family, including any minors whether or not accompanying the individual, and the personal representative, executors, and administrators of the individual.
- 2. Release and Waiver of All Claims and Covenant Not to Sue. In consideration of participation in the activities of PBCH and BCHI by me, by my spouse, children and other dependents, I irrevocably waive and release PBCH and BCHI and the owners of all facilities, equipment, and land used in PBCH and BCHI activities from, and WAIVE MY SUBSTANTIAL RIGHT TO ASSERT ANY CAUSE OF ACTION, CLAIM OR DEMANDS OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER, including by not limited to, any claim of negligence, which I may have or acquire in the future against PBCH and BCHI on account of personal injury, property damage, death, or accident of any kind, arising from my involvement in PBCH and BCHI activities, however the injury or damage is caused, including, but not limited to, the negligence of PBCH or BCHI. I contractually release PBCH and BCHI and agree to hold PBCH and BCHI harmless from any and all liability for any claims, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, or suits of any kind or nature whatsoever, which result or may result in the future from activities sponsored by PBCH or BCHI or coordinated by PBCH or BCHI members. This release applies to all PBCH and BCHI activities in the future in which I may participate. This release shall be effective and apply to all my heirs and the members of my family, including any minors, whether or not accompanying me, and my personal representative, executors, and administrators.
- 3. Legal Action Limitation. If any of the entities listed above has to take legal action in relation to this Agreement, and the entity is successful in the action, the unsuccessful party shall pay to the entity, in addition to all sums that the unsuccessful party may be called on to pay, a reasonable sum for the entity's attorney's fees and court costs. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Idaho. Venue for any dispute or litigation arising out of this Agreement shall be in Kootenai County State District Court. Any modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this Agreement shall be binding only if in writing signed by each party or authorized representative of each party. There shall be no oral amendment or modification of this Agreement.
- **4. Acknowledgment of Risk.** I hereby acknowledge and agree that activities of PBCH and BCHI are frequently inherently dangerous and have a high degree of risk. I acknowledge that by execution hereof, I am waiving and releasing all claims against PBCH and BCHI for any injury whatsoever. I agree to participate as a common adventurer, being personally responsible for my own safety and not looking to any others to protect me from harm.
- **5. Statement of Capacity and Understanding.** I will not undertake any activity of PBCH or BCHI without becoming fully aware of the nature and extent of the risks inherent therein. By participation, I am voluntarily assuming the risks. I will not engage in the activities unless I am in good health and have no physical limitations, which could preclude my safe participation. I understand I am responsible for my own instruction in safety and providing for my own safety. I am of lawful age (18 years or older) and other wise legally competent to sign this agreement. I understand that the terms of this agreement are contractual and legally binding. By signing this agreement, I acknowledge that I have carefully read this agreement, and sign if of my own free will.
