





HAY HAULING AT RED IVES

Take three semi-packers, five pack stock and two helpers and in two days you can move some hay. The Avery Ranger District is undertaking a trail project several miles beyond the end of the road in the St Joe River area. They ask for help staging hay about 5.5 miles up the river; allowing them more resources to move equipment and crew. Bob and Linda Funke, Bob Williams and Jerry and Diane Shriner manteed the bales, with assistance from Mike a FS employee that knows about stock use. Then the FS hauled them to the end of the road. The packers rode two miles from camp to the end of the road then loaded the bales and packed them up river from Spruce Creek. 10 bales on Friday and 10 on Saturday. Bob Funke found out just how good his mule "Newt" is.


