### Trail Clearing at 4<sup>th</sup> of July Recreation Area Written by Bea Christopherson

Saturday, Oct. 12 we worked together with the Panhandle Nordic Ski Club to clear trail at 4th of July Recreation Area. A total of nine people showed up and we de-brushed the lower snowshoe trail, Jeanette's Jaunt. This trail is located below the main parking lot and ending in the area were the picnic table is.

The trail contains some water crossings but is mostly flat alongside the hillside. It will add another loop for horseback riders and ties into the main trail system. The weather was a bit cool in the morning but warmed up quickly as we were working.

Geoff Harvey, Glenn Truscott, and Al Mayer from the PNC were cutting with the blade saws on the many small trees which had overtaken the trail. From the PBCH Angela Parsons, Joni Lueck, Chris Schaller, Karen Kimball, Sandy Beamer and Bea Christopherson removed the brush and trees and did hand nipper work.

Our group ended up clearing about 3,000 feet with roughly 2,000 being left. The PNC is hoping to finish clearing the trail within the next few weeks.


Long-time member Geoff Harvey of PNC added, "After over two months of work off and on, Jeanette's Jaunt has been cleared end to end. As many of you know the trail was filled with numerous half to over and inch diameter saplings that made passage difficult on foot and approaching impossible on snowshoes. Thanks to the efforts of the Thursday Hiking Group in August and the Backcountry Horsemen in October, we were able to finish the last section today. We appreciate the help of all those who contributed to this effort. We hope the clearing will allow for more enjoyable snowshoeing this winter and horseback and hiking next summer."

The directors are working really hard to fight for trail maintenance to be done by U.S. Forest Service. Also discussed Youth Programs.

In 2015 National dues will be increased by \$5.00. We will discuss further in 2014. This is a pretty nominal increase considering other states dues such as Washington.

NEW BUSINESS: We have a nominating committee who will research volunteers for the Board of Directors. Jill Reineccius has asked to be replaced and Bob Funke will need to be replaced. Jerry Shriner and Bill Clarke will have one more year. Elections will be held in November.

We are working on Trail Boss plaques - possibly made and engraved on plastic to save cost.

Saturday, October 19 was a great day to visit Riverside State Park and ride the trails there. Myself and three others looked at the new camping spots and arena that have been installed in the past year. There is plenty of parking for horse trailers. The area was once used as a horse rental business so some wood structure is still in place as well as a great trail system.

We rode the lower trail that follows the Spokane River which was quite clear and green in color. The trees were in full color. The riding trails were out in the sun for most of our 5-mile ride. It makes a better ride in the spring and fall vs. the summer months as it can be hot there.

The state parks have been busy since the opening of the hunting season so this is another option. You do have to have a Coggins Test to travel to another state and a Washington Parks Pass.






