

Blue Creek trail clearing and fun ride. Saturday, April 16. Meet at 10 a.m. Foot in stirrup 11 a.m. Bring a lunch for on the trail. Trail boss Joni Lueck. Email jklhorserider@gmail.com This is a well-marked 700-acre trail system managed by BLM. There is a gradual climb and 2 switchbacks to reach the top of the hill. Great views of Wolf Lodge Bay and Blue Creek Bay. May see some wildlife in this rural area. Ride could be about two or three hours. Will have chainsaws with us in case of downed trees. Please bring nippers and hand saws. Directions: Parking is either in upper parking lot off Yellowstone Trail Road or near boat loading area off Blue Creek Bay Rd. Either take Wolf Lodge exit off I-90 east from Coeur d'Alene. Turn left and go over I-90. At Dumpsters, turn left onto Yellowstone Trail Rd. and continue two miles to upper parking lot. Or to park near boat launch take Mullan Trail exit off I-90 heading east from Coeur d'Alene, then to Sunnyside Rd. turn left and stay left. Follow it to Yellowstone Trail and left and then right onto Blue Creek Bay Rd. to boat launch or go another 1/4 mile on Yellowstone Trail Rd. to parking area on left. Room for 4 trailers in parking lot and 2 trailers on road.

Diane and Jerry Shriner will give a presentation on their mule trip in Baja, Mexico to the Painted Caves. It is a 1500-year-old historical site. Scenes show hunting, the renewal of life and a profound view of the world. One of the most important historical heritages of its kind in the world.

The Saturday ride will be four hours along open rolling plains and crossing one creek. The Sunday ride will be three hours roundtrip to Towell Falls. Need health certificate to travel to Washington. Directions: Google Escure Ranch and several sites come up including photos, maps, info about the ranch, geography, etc.

There are different routes to the ranch. This is the best: from Idaho go west on I-90 to the Sprague exit 245, go south on State Hwy 23 8.1 miles to Lamont Rd, turn right and go 2.6 mi to a Y and keep left on Revere Rd 8.3 miles, turn rt on to Jordan-Knott Rd 2.2 miles to the BLM Rock Cr Management Area sign, turn rt 2.5 miles to the trail head. There is stock water, pasture (but you may want to bring your own weed-free feed) and ample parking. There are no trees for highlines and only two small pens. We will have coffee in the mornings and have the grill going for folks who want to gather around the fire and share breakfast. Plan on potluck Saturday evening.

April 29 Friday, Work Party at English Point. Meet at 8 a.m. and work with other non-motorized groups to clean up and fix the trails here. I hope the people who ride here will come out and work on this joint non-motorized work party. I will bring nippers. Karen Kimball 772-2434.
