BLUE CREEK Recreation Area Trail Expansion Update

Coeur d'Alene BLM was contacted to get an update on the trail expansion at Blue Creek Recreation area east of Coeur d'Alene. To date, little has been started due partly to the fact that the approved proposal

and plan were appealed, and that appeal has been denied. Also the timber thinning and sales has not been completed. I talked both to Mitchell and Kurt of BLM on March 5, 2018 and this is my understanding of what they told me:

East Side Trails

- Blue trail, where it leaves the parking lot on Yellowstone Trail, has been reworked to eliminate the steep climb into more switchbacks and gentler climb following more of the land contours.
- Proposed "kid friendly" trail is planned for this summer, as well as some work to the existing trails.
- The Meadow parking lot construction should begin this summer.
- Improvements to the Red trail parking area planned for this summer.
- Fuels reduction and thinning has to be completed before any of the construction can begin, which they hope will be completed this summer and fall.

West Side Trails (New trails proposed for horses and mountain bike riders.)

- Trails cannot be started until proposed logging and timber sales is completed, which should be this summer and fall. Trail construction will probably begin next year with the exception of the connector trail between the West and East side trails.
- The Bonnell parking lot construction will be fairly easy and quick.

Once trail construction is started, BLM is asking for assistance from members of Backcountry Horsemen.
