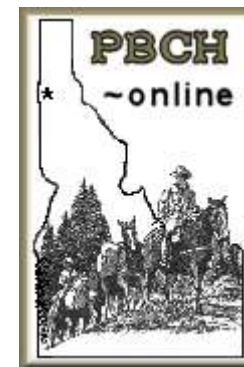

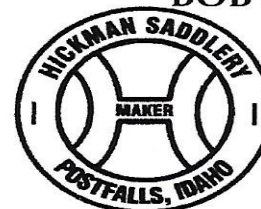

Agenda

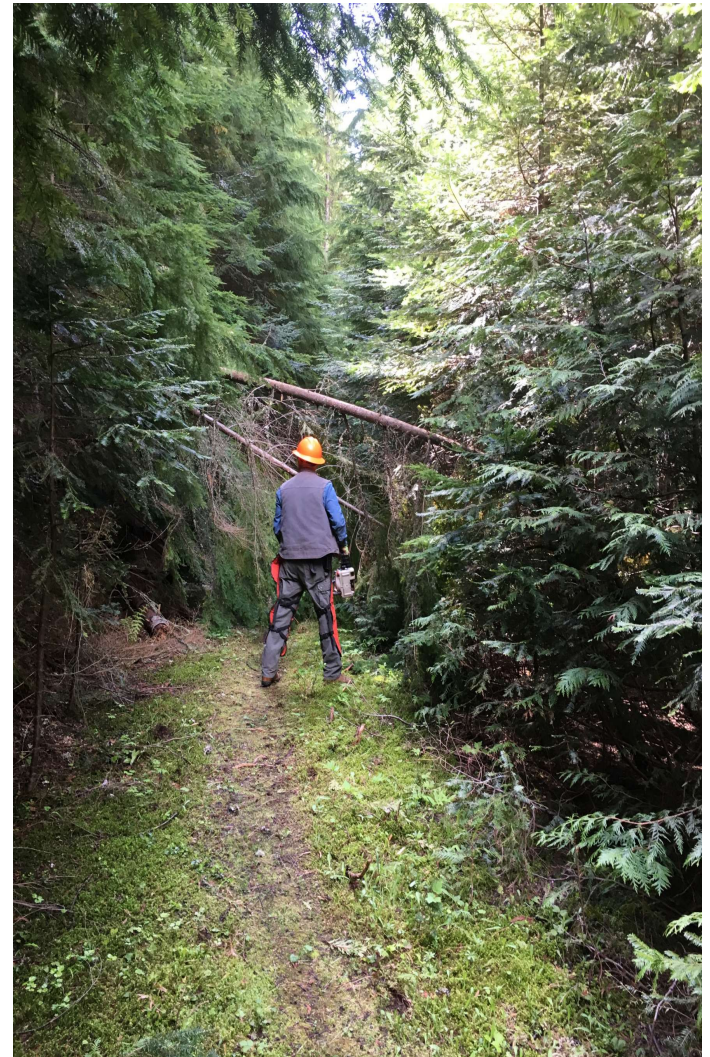
1. Someone to do articles in Newsletter. We are still looking for someone to submit articles in the state newsletter
2. Marie Creek Clearing May 11th: Canceled due to Forest Service work party had already cleared trail.
3. Heyburn State Park Clearing May 18th north side: Jerry Shriner reported not too much work to do. Work Party to start at 9- 9:30. Will get in a very nice ride. Maybe some will want to camp out on Saturday Night on the south side camping area.
4. Asotin Creek Campout May 24th through 27th Fordyce Trailhead camping area: chapter has some trail work to do and are bringing chainsaws. Need to have weed free hay, Discover Pass. any questions call Karen Kimball. RSVP. Barbecue will be available . Will have Hamburgers Friday night. Potluck Saturday, Sunday night. What a beautiful spring day to complete a trail clearing party at Heyburn. We started at 9:30 in the morning after meeting at the north side trailhead. Irv and I arrived at 9:10 and Jerry and Diane were already there getting geared up. Diane had two packhorses she handled the entire time. We got on the trail around 9:40 and it wasn't too long until we came upon the first downed tree across the trail.

Jerry got his chainsaw and we proceeded to clear this spot. I helped clear the timber after Jerry cut it up at the first spot, while Irv held our horses.

Jerry's horse just followed along on his own as we moved a little down trail to clear another spot; very impressed with his horse. There were several other spots that we cleared with myself holding the horses and Irv moving the cut up logs off the trail.

I believe Jerry called the lunch spot Indian Cliffs which is a beautiful spot to stop for lunch with hitching posts to tie up to. My horse decided the grass looked better on the other side of the post and attempted to limbo under it, which worked until he got to the saddle horn and was then stuck. I was able to back him up without issue but it was a funny sight.

Our entire trail clearing/fun ride was 11.4 with 3500' in altitude gained. There were a couple of steep spots on this trail, but well worth the ride. This was our first work party and we totally enjoyed it. Diane and Jerry are a pleasure to ride with.
