



#### **Highlights Of the State Board of Directors Meeting**

The Legal Fund was discussed at the annual State Board of Directors meeting held in March. This is part of the reason why we sell calendars. If we would have to go to court with any government agency over keeping trails open we need at least \$50,000 in this fund. There have been three cases involving this type of action. The first was in California in which BCH took it to court and one the case. There was a case in Tennessee and didn't go to court because of the challenge of BCH. And there was a Trail Classification case throughout the states where all trails, even from the past, were put on the maps. The Forest Service can not remove any trail without good cause and publicizing. Some of you may remember this case. I reviewed the trail classification sheets from our area and they are at the local office for review at any time.

Our Education Chairman, Marybeth Conger, is resigning. She has been working with education for BCH for 30 years. Her and her husband Bill, who has been involved in BCH also, have retired and are going to do some traveling. We are looking for someone to replace her position. If anyone is interested please let me know. Marybeth is willing to lend a hand and help prepare someone for this position. I have been helping her out in the northern part of the state.

The State website has a new look and is very informative. There is a page that needs a password to get into for members. I will give that out at the meeting or you can email me for it. I hope that everyone will take a look at it. It's great and Jill Nebeker has been working hard to redo and manage the site.

There was discussion about the State Newsletter being sent out by email. It will also be on the State Website. If a person needs a hard copy it can be provided. This will save BCHI some money. I will let you know if I hear more on this.

The next SBD meeting will be in September in Donnelly and the annual BCHI convention is next March in Burley.
