



We have a new Education Chair and she is bursting with ideas. She did this type of volunteer work in California and will be passing on some new information for the State and chapters. She replaced Marybeth Conger after her 30 years of working with Washington, Idaho and BCHA on Education. Marybeth was presented with a jacket from the State for her great volunteer service of many years.

There is a YouTube video just put on the BCHI Website titled "Basic Trail Maintenance". It is very helpful on proper ways to clear and maintain trails.

E-Bikes are still a concern for people riding on trails. BCHA is working to keep them out of Forest Service non-motorized trails. BCHA may file a lawsuit with the Park Service over the use of e-bike on their trails.

The general public camping in "Equine Camping Only" is also a problem. Forest Service does not always acknowledge this. At the meeting we came up with a list of these Trailheads and the State will try to work with the Forest Service to keep it open for equine use only.

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was brought to the meeting. Some of the chapters are purchasing them for use on trails.

March 18-19 will be the next BCHI Convention in Burley, Idaho the theme is "Open Trails, Our Legacy, Our Future".
